UC Berkeley Washington Program courses are approved by the Academic Senate as regular UC Berkeley courses, and they appear on students' transcripts as such. The main coursework students do in Washington is the Research Seminar, a 10.5 unit course that is cross-listed in eight UCB departments: History of Art, History, Mass Communications, Political Economy of Industrial Societies, Political Science, Sociology, Undergraduate & Interdisciplinary Studies, and Women's Studies. D.C. elective course listings, from which students typically choose one course (around 3 units), will be available one to two months before the beginning of the term.
